FlexSchool is a liberal arts middle and high school for gifted and twice exceptional students. Gifts are emphasized and learning challenges are supported as necessary. All admitted students are intellectually curious and able to conduct in-depth analysis in a discussion-based class. Students may attend either in-person or by remoting into live classrooms via Cloud Classroom.

All courses are taught at the honors level, though the workload is adjusted to the needs of the class to allow for acceleration and more depth. Students are placed in classes by ability rather than age. While we do not offer AP courses, teachers cover material for AP exams and many students take AP and SAT subject tests.

Report cards have traditional letter grades (A, B, C, D, N/A, Pass/Fail), narrative comments, and a psychosocial scale. Class rank and GPA are not computed.

Philosophy & History

Philosophy and history – FlexSchool is specially designed for gifted and twice exceptional (2e) students in grades 5–12, PG. Small, ability-based liberal arts classes taught by subject experts ensure meaningful conversations and the opportunity to ask high-level questions. FlexSchools are deliberately embedded in the community to use local resources. Examples of this include experiential learning to augment academic subjects in the local area every Friday (FlexFridays).
